ONE YEAR ON THE FIGHT TO DEFEND OUR CHILDREN CONTINUES

Last year, the Government quietly passed a law allowing the Department for Education (DfE) to collect children's country of birth and nationality data through the school census. There is no educational justification or otherwise for the collection of this data.

Identifiable information on children aged 5–19 is collected by schools and stored on the National Pupil Database (NPD) forever. The DfE regularly hands out identifiable information to third parties, including journalists and private companies. The NPD is also accessed by the police

WHAT CAN PARENTS AND SCHOOLS DO?

- 1) REFUSE any requests for your child's country of birth / nationality. This is your right and your child's school must make you aware of this.
- 2) RETRACT any previously submitted country of birth / nationality data. This right was won by our campaign and you child's school must make you aware of this.
- 3) RESIST Talk to your family, friends, co-workers, teachers, head teachers and governors. Tell us why you oppose this policy and we will support your concerns into action.

ALL CHILDREN HAVE THE RIGHT TO GO TO SCHOOL AND FEEL SAFE

We discovered that since 2015 the DfE has had an agreement to share up to 1,500 children's names and addresses with the Home Office for immigration enforcement. The agreement doesn't just target undocumented children, but any child that has an undocumented family member that might be traced through their school records.

In a post Brexit world where we see growing anti-migrant rhetoric and violence daily, we must resist all attempts by Theresa May and other politicians to create a "hostile environment" for migrants and resist borders in our schools.
