

Request to remove school census data: country of birth, nationality, first language, ethnicity

I am writing to ask for the removal of these personal data from their school records (ticked):

- country of birth
- nationality
- first language
- ethnicity

Please record my objection and refusal of data

- record my objection at school level as "refused".
- request the withdrawal of data already provided to the Department for Education (DfE)
- ensure my Right to Object at DfE is upheld under Article 21 of the General Data Protection Regulation¹.

Retract data previously submitted

The Department for Education School Census 2018-19 Guidance, version 1.3, September 2018² states that Nationality, and Country-of-Birth, and Language Proficiency must no longer be collected or stored for school census purposes, to submit to the Department for Education, with immediate effect.

Grounds

Data must only be submitted for educational purposes as required under s537a of the Education Act 1996. In July 2016 in a written parliamentary question³, the Schools Minister said of nationality and country-of-birth that, "*The data will be collected solely for internal Departmental use for the analytical, statistical and research purposes ... There are currently no plans to share the data with other government Departments*". But the live data sharing agreement already included "nationality (once collected)" in the information to be transferred between the Home Office and DfE for purposes including the strategic aims of the Hostile Environment.⁴ The government plans to expand the use of national pupil data for immigration enforcement purposes through a new exemption in the Data Protection Act introduced in May 2018.⁵ Further, any national research using the data collected is not meaningful, since no recorded nationality was submitted⁶ for 25.6% of pupils. There are no safeguards in place how the data will be used in future.

There are therefore compelling grounds to uphold our rights of erasure and objection to processing.
